Racial, age, disability, gender, nationality, religion, sexual orientation and weight.

KEY POINT: IN JESUS WE ARE ALL ONE

Bagalatia 3:28 / KwabaseGalathiya 3:28 / Galatians 3:28 “There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.”

KEY POINT: JESUS HIMSELF TAUGHT US NOT TO DISCRIMINATE

Johane 13:14-16 / NgokukaJohane 13:14-16 / John 13:14-16 “**14** Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another’s feet. **15** I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. **16** Very truly I tell you, no servant is greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him.

KEY POINT: DISCRIMINATION LEADS YOU TO JUDGE PEOPLE

Jakobo 2:2-4 / EkaJakobe 2:2-4 / James 2:2-4 “**2** Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in filthy old clothes also comes in. **3** If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, “Here’s a good seat for you,” but say to the poor man, “You stand there” or “Sit on the floor by my feet,” **4** have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?”

KEY POINT: GOD COMMANDS US TO LOVE EACH OTHER

Mareka 12:31 / NgokukaMarku 12:31 / Mark 12:31 “The second is this: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no commandment greater than these.”

KEY POINT: YOU NEED TO BE HUMBLE, GENTLE, PATIENT AND TOLERANT WITH OTHERS

Baefeso 4:2 / Kwabase-Efesu 4:2 / Ephesians 4:2 “Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.”
